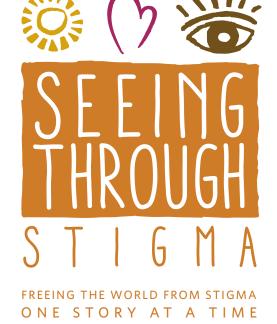

Who We Are

The "Seeing Through Stigma" campaign grew out of an earlier advocacy movement aimed at changing the adverse images of those living with mental health challenges and their misunderstood portrayal in the media. The Stamp Out Stigma (SOS) program was founded in 1990 by Carmen Lee. Seeing Through Stigma continues the work of this groundbreaking anti-stigma program.

The result is, now those who have been previously "Unseen" can tell their story and be witnessed standing in their strength.

Services

Seeing Through Stigma presentations consist of 3 panelists who share personal experiences of living with mental health challenges, relating their own experiences of stigma and how they have worked to change the adverse societal perceptions.

Presentations are interactive, and the audience is encouraged to ask questions.
